## Underground Infrastructure Upgrade

In 2017 Council accepted an Infrastructure Management Plan that was the result of reviewing the condition of underground sewer lines as well as water and roads. It laid out 6 different prioritized projects.

This fall the Village will be undertaking the 1st Phase replacing lines and re-routing the southend flow of waste water to the lift station on Foothills Drive up to Mountain View Place as well as crossing the Hwy 22.

If budget permits there will be a second section of underground work done from Honky Tonks to the Esso. Some of this is being moved forward in advance of Alberta Transportation repaving Highway 22 from Longview to Black Diamond in the next few years.

Schedule: The goal is to get started on Foothills Drive mid August and on Hwy 22 after Labour Day to minimize the impact on traffic. The work should take a month.



# Be Bear Aware™

There have been bear sightings in the Village. Probably a young bear looking for food. Please be vigilant in keeping your garbage in a closed container as required by our **Waste Bylaw 413-18** and not leaving other attractants out.

Council recently passed a new **Community Standards Bylaw 405-17** that addresses the issue of fruit trees. In short;

Fruit trees in residential areas of Longview bring bears into the town site.

If you can't remove the tree, it is your responsibility to remove the fruit as soon as it begins to ripen and bring it indoors or properly dispose of it.

No person or owner of a parcel of land shall permit fruit from a tree or bush, or otherwise located on a parcel of land, to accumulate on the tree, bush or ground such that it attracts dangerous wildlife.

Violation fines under this bylaw are

First offence	\$250
Second offence	\$500
