



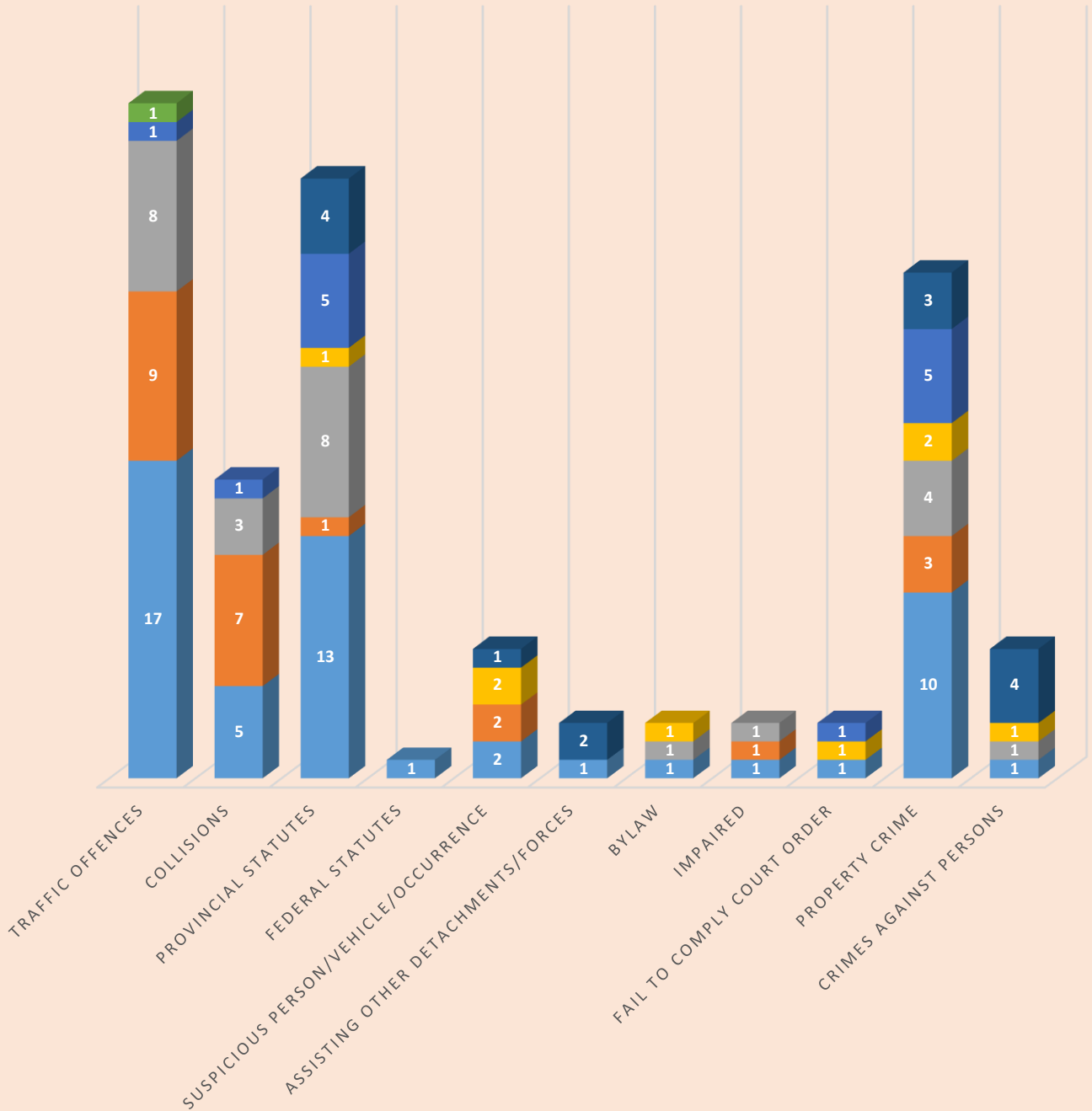

On August 16, 2021, at approximately 7:30pm, two youth were walking near the Fas Gas on Centre Avenue in Black Diamond when a male pulled up next to them in a black Dodge truck blaring his music. When the youth looked at this male, he flashed what appeared to be a black handgun at them during a verbal altercation based on comments regarding his music. Video was obtained from the surrounding area by Foothills RCMP (Turner Valley) members, which identified the accused. A 28-year old male from Black Diamond has been charged criminally with Possession of a Weapon Dangerous to the Public Peace and Fail to Comply with Probation, and is set to appear in Turner Valley Provincial Court on October 26, 2021

(The handgun was later seized and identified as a pellet gun; the availability of surveillance video from surrounding business was instrumental in the accused identification)

On August 17, 2021, Foothills County RCMP responded to a two vehicle MVC at the intersection of Highway 799 and 434 Avenue, Foothills County. The investigation revealed that a vehicle was traveling southbound on Highway 799, when a vehicle traveling westbound on 434 Avenue failed to stop properly at the stop and hit the southbound vehicle. Two vehicle occupants were transported to High River Hospital for evaluation and later released. A 51-year old male from Calgary has been charged with failing to proceed safely after stopping.

Foothills County RCMP (Okotoks Detachment) continue to receive complaints of unknown individuals going onto private property on 32 street East, Foothills County, leaving garbage and having parties. The RCMP want to remind everyone that entering on private property without consent is an offence, which could result in person(s) being charged with Trespass and face a substantial fine. If anyone has information regarding this situation, they are asked to contact the Foothills County RCMP (Okotoks Detachment)

We are starting to receive complaints in relation to Drone operations within the Foothills County. As such I want to outline the basic information regarding Drone operations.

All Drones that weigh over 250 grams (.55 pounds) must be registered with Transport Canada, and operators must obtain and carry a valid Drone pilot certificate. Once these larger drones are registered the registration number must be identified on the drone.

Drones under 250 grams do not require the owner to register them nor do they have to obtain and carry a Drone pilot certificate.

All drone operators must follow the following rules;

- Fly your drone where you can see it all times.
- Fly below 400 feet (122 meters) in the air.
- Drones cannot fly directly over an individual without their consent.
- They cannot be operated within 3 nautical miles of an airport or 1 nautical mile of a heliport.

The Trespass Act does not apply to drone operations over private property, as the airspace over that property is not owned. It would only apply if that intrusion was permanent or interferes with the property owners' reasonable enjoyment of their property.
