**BEAR AWARE:** Please be vigilant and keep your garbage in a closed container or better yet, if possible, don't put it out until Friday morning (close to 8:00 am).

The **Community Standards Bylaw 405-17** addresses the issue of fruit trees and bird feeders. In short, No person or owner of a property shall permit fruit from a tree or bush, to accumulate on the **tree**, **bush or** 

**ground** such that it attracts wildlife. If you can't remove the tree, it is your responsibility to remove the fruit as soon as it begins to ripen and bring it indoors or properly dispose of it. Bird feeders must be removed from September 1st to the end of November.

When bears get relocated by Fish and Wildlife only about 50% of them survive, please do your part...
