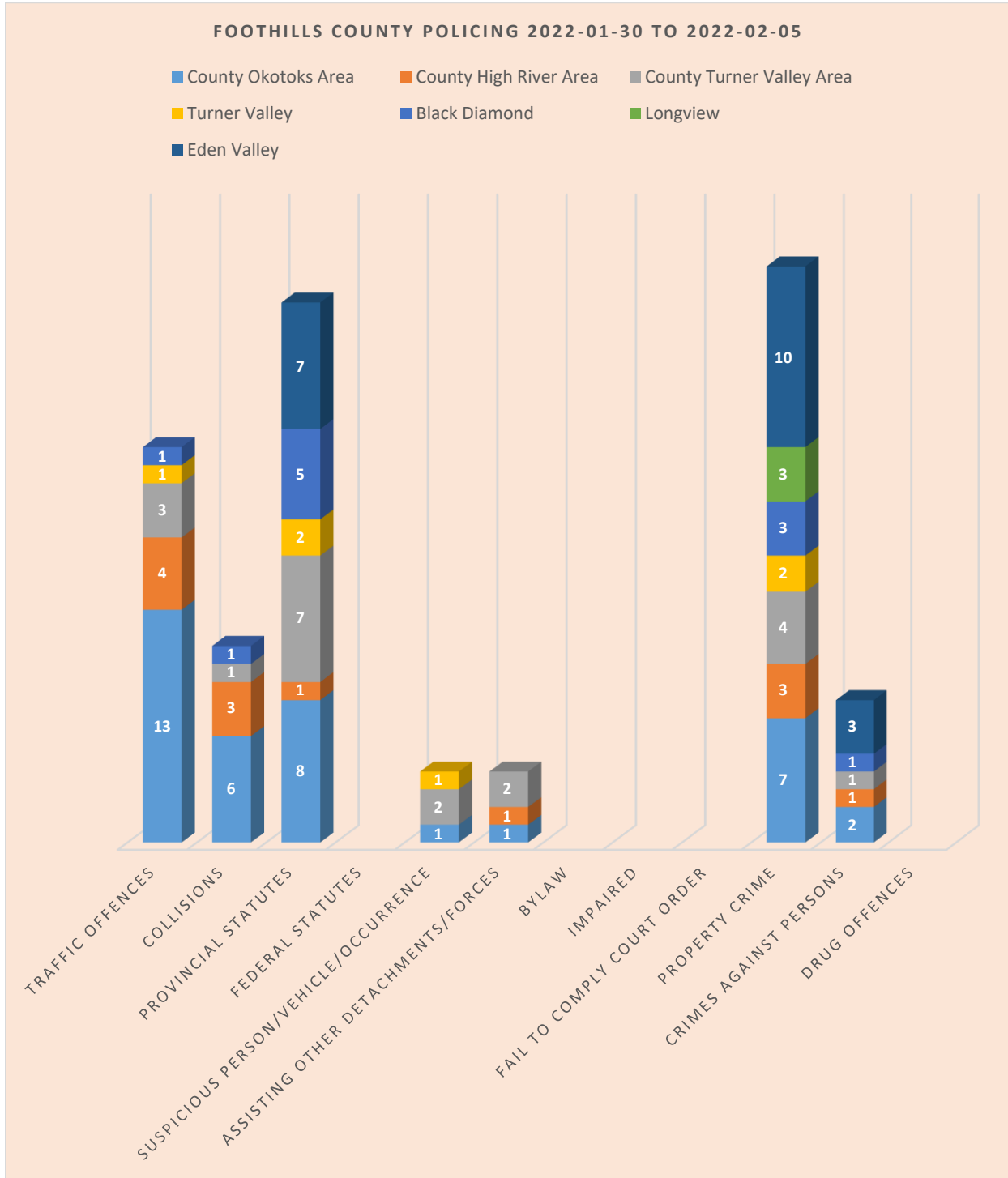

Sometime between January 30th and 31st, 2022, unknown suspect(s) broke a driveway lock gaining access to a property on Highway 549 West, Foothills County. Once on the property a red 2008 Polaris Ranger, generator and other property had been stolen. Foothills County RCMP are asking anyone that may have video footage of that area or information related to this criminal code offence to contact the Foothills County RCMP (Turner Valley) or Crime Stoppers. This matter is still under investigation.

On February 2, 2022, Foothills County RCMP responded to a Break and Enter to the Canadian Natural Resources site. Once on location, suspect(s) stole an air compressor, which caused disruption to production and fluid leaks. This matter is still under investigation and damage estimates are high. If anyone has surveillance video in this area or information regarding this criminal code offence you are asked to contact the Foothills County RCMP(Turner Valley).

On February 3, 2022 at 1:00pm, Foothills County RCMP were advised of a “Freedom Convoy” road blockage on Highway 22 at the intersection of Highway 540. RCMP immediately attended the location and requested protestors to remove their vehicles from the highway as part of traffic Safety. The protestors were cooperative removing vehicles from the roadway and protesting at that location from the ditch area.

On February 6, 2022 at 11:30am, Foothills County RCMP responded to numerous calls regarding a “Freedom Convoy” traveling from the Okotoks Erratic to Okotoks on Highway 7. Due to size of the convoy, several vehicles traveling both east/west on the highway attempted to pass this group in an unsafe manner almost causing several collisions. The RCMP want to remind everyone that Public Safety is the primary concern regarding these situations and will actively work to allow for a persons right to lawful protest and assembly but not at the risk of public safety, and if required lawful authorities will be applied under the Traffic Safety and other provincial acts.

The Foothills County RCMP and Foothills County CPO's have received numerous complaints regarding illegal parking on the highway 549 at Brown-Lowry Park. There is a grave concern for Public Safety at this location, as once the parking lot area is full vehicles are parking on both sides of the highway, hindering the free flow of traffic in both directions, causing only single vehicle travel through this location.

For this reason, no parking signs have been installed on the highway at each end of the location. To ensure public safety in this location, Foothills County RCMP and Foothills County CPO's will be conducting active patrols of the area. Anyone that is found to be illegally parking may face a violation ticket under the Use of Highway Rules of the Road for "Park where prohibited by traffic control device" with an associated fine of 81-dollars.

The Foothills County RCMP encourages everyone to use the Provincial Park systems in a safe manner following all rules and regulations associated to their use.
