



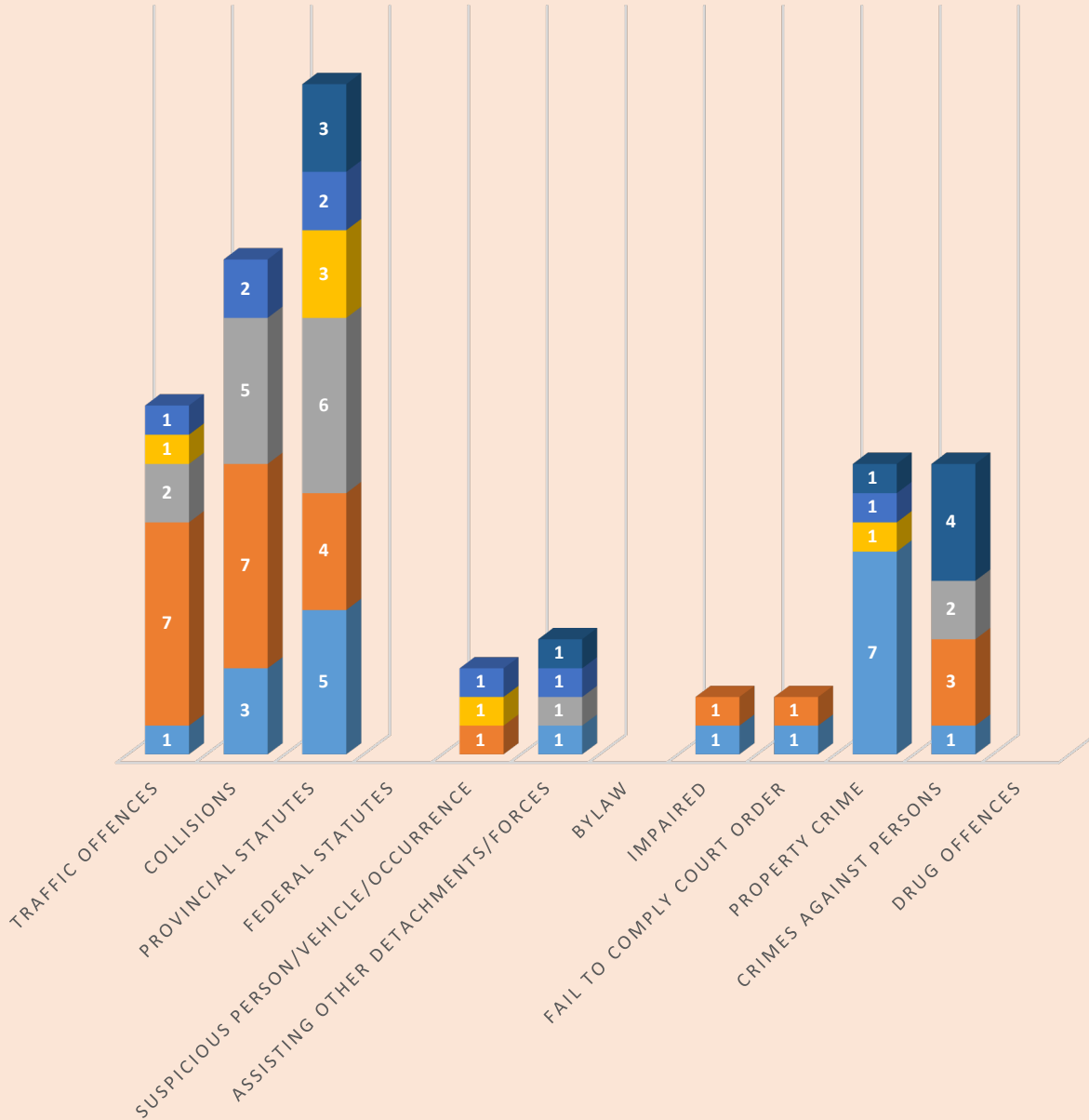

#### **WHAT WENT ON LAST WEEK?**

On April 11, Foothills County RCMP received a complaint of a vehicle making an unsafe pass on hwy 2A near Aldersyde. The vehicle was located and the driver was warned as per the complainants wishes.

On April 11, a Foothills County resident reported being the victim of fraud after receiving a phone call from a bank advising their credit card was ready for pickup although they had not applied for a new credit card. The investigation revealed that a suspect had fraudulently obtained four credit cards using the victim's name. A suspect has been identified and the investigation is ongoing.

On April 11, Foothills County RCMP assisted Calgary police in apprehending a suspect in a stolen vehicle. The suspect was taken in to custody and charged by Calgary Police.

On April 12, Foothills School Division provided the RCMP video footage of six instances of vehicles passing school buses with stop signs and red lights flashing from the preceding month. Based on this evidence, violation tickets were issued to the registered owner of each vehicle.

*Officer's comment: "It's critically important to recognize and follow school bus stop lights and signs, please do your part to keep our kids safe!"*

On April 13, Foothills County RCMP, Fire and EMS responded to a two vehicle collision on hwy 22 near Priddis. A westbound pickup that was making a turn had been struck an eastbound SUV head-on. Both drivers sustained minor injuries and were transported to hospital by EMS for further assessment.

On April 14, Foothills County RCMP responded to what was suspected to be a residential break and enter. Officers cleared the residence and determined the likely cause of the insecure house was a faulty door lock, the house did not appear to have been entered, and no items were missing or out of order.

On April 15, Foothills RCMP stopped a suspended driver on hwy 552. The suspended driver then failed a roadside alcohol screening. The driver's vehicle was seized, his license suspension continues, and he now has a date in court.

On April 15, Foothills County RCMP attended a residence to warn a driver about a stunting complaint, and arrest the driver for outstanding warrants from Calgary Police. The driver was released on an Appearance Notice for court in Calgary.

On April 15, Foothills County RCMP initiated an investigation in to historical assaults at Eden Valley First Nations. The investigation is ongoing.

Sometime overnight on April 15-16, unknown suspect(s) broke in to Tanbridge Academy and damaged a classroom. The investigation is ongoing.

Have you heard of the Foothills CAPTURE Program?

**C**ommunity Assisted **P**olicing **T**hrough **U**se of **R**ecorded **E**vidence

The Foothills CAPTURE Program is an initiative started by one of our officers, Cst. Issa, to help solve more crime in Foothills County.

**What is the CAPTURE program?** When police are investigating crime they will conduct neighborhood inquiries to locate witnesses or video footage to assist with the investigation. With the knowledge of security camera locations, the time to conduct the inquiries may be shortened and provide key information that could aid with the investigation. Using the CAPTURE mapping program, when a crime occurs officers will be able to instantly see which residences in the area have security video that may be of use.

Even when you register with the CAPTURE program, you have the option of whether to share or hand over any footage or images that may assist police.

The program is one hundred percent voluntary and police will not have access to any live video feed of any participant. The list of registered properties is kept confidential and only police will have access to it.
