**Bylaw 466-23 Borrowing Credit Card Bylaw – 2023**

Being a Bylaw of the Village of Longview, in the Province of Alberta, to authorize the municipality to incur indebtedness as a credit card holder.

**WHEREAS:** Pursuant to the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26 and amendments thereto, Council has decided to proceed with a bylaw pursuant to Section 256 to authorize the financing and interim borrowing of certain funds of money for operational expenditures.

**PURSUANT TO AND UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LONGVIEW, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, DULY ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The purpose of the loan is for the issuance of a corporate credit card and therefore enacts that the Corporation borrow from Alberta Treasury Branches or other financial institution up to the principal sum of ten thousand (\$10,000) repayable upon demand at a rate of interest per annum from time to time established by the financial institution to maximum of 21%. Interest will be calculated daily and due and payable monthly on the last day of each and every month.
2. The source of money to be used to repay any principal and interest owing under this borrowing will come from general municipal taxation. The Municipality shall levy and raise in each year municipal taxes sufficient to pay the indebtedness.
3. The indebtedness shall be contracted on the credit and security of the Municipality.
4. The amount to be borrowed and the term of the loan will not exceed any restrictions set forth in the *Municipal Government Act*.
5. The proper officers of the Municipalities are hereby authorized to apply for credit card borrowing and to arrange the amount, terms and conditions of the loan and securities with the financial institution, except that the loan term shall not exceed three (3) years.
6. This bylaw comes into force on the date it is passed.

**READ A FIRST, SECOND, AND WITH UNANIMOUS CONSENT, READ A THIRD TIME AND FINALLY PASSED THIS 16<sup>th</sup> DAY OF MAY 2023.**
